- VII. Status Update Pan Chemical, 55 Schoon Avenue, and Christian Health Care Center
- a. Pan Chemical – Town issued summons on December 30, 2008 for property maintenance, Hawthorne won Tax Appeal in Appellate court against Pan Chemical, boarding of the building continues, and Environmental Commission gave the Borough Clerk all Pan Chemicals environmental reports from the recent NJDEP File Review request from Commission.

- VIII. Report from Planning Board – 280 and 300 Ninth Avenue (Hawthorne Spring and Minifold Inc) property is in the process of being sold to Realty Acquisition Group, LLC (RAG) in Feb. 2009. As part of the property transaction, RAG has conducted an environmental due diligence. *Next Step: The Environmental Commission is requesting copies of the environmental reports to review to ensure that the re-development of the property protects the environment and human health of the residents of Hawthorne.* The Planning Board in February 2009 will be hearing RAG presentation on their re-development building plans for the property.
