Letter from Mayor Lane

Dear Resident,

This week it was brought to my attention that many of you didn't receive your November and December water bills. I understand that the lack of service by our post office is frustrating. Please take note that you can always look at your account online through the borough website www.hawthornenj.org. On the top line *How Do I*, you can click and scroll down to *Pay Online (Taxes, Traffic Tickets, Water Bills)* where you can monitor your account; we don't want our residents to get charged interest for late payments, which is a charge we are unable to negate. You don't have to pay online; you can continue to pay in person or through mail. The borough communicates to its residents via *Nixle, Facebook, and TapInto Hawthorne*; I encourage you to share this information with your friends and neighbors so that everyone will receive important communication from us.

This week water routes 21-26 were mailed. For your convenience, I have attached a list of when the various water routes are mailed throughout the year, with accompanying routes which show the streets in each route; I believe this will be helpful.

Our Traffic Bureau once again calls your attention to their attached advisory flyer; please take the time to read it. Also, I want to bring your attention to the fact that many drivers are speeding throughout town, on the main streets and secondary ones. Please be aware that our police are ticketing for speeding.

This year marks the 27th anniversary of the Hawthorne Junior Police Academy. This is a fun and informative program geared toward seventh and eighth graders. Hawthorne Police Department Traffic Bureau School Zone Safety Advisory

School zones are high-traffic areas requiring increased awareness and responsible driving to ensure the safety of students, parents, and school personnel. The combination of pedestrians, vehicles, and crossing guards managing traffic flow makes it essential for everyone to follow proper safety guidelines.

For Pedestrians:

To enhance safety, always use designated crosswalks when crossing the street. Parents and guardians should teach children to avoid crossing between parked cars or in the middle of the street and instead proceed to the nearest marked crosswalk. Doing so increases visibility for drivers and helps prevent accidents.

For Drivers:

Drivers must remain alert, patient, and focused when traveling through school zones. Distractions and aggressive driving put pedestrians, particularly children, at risk.

When approaching a school crosswalk, it is important to:

- Come to a full stop when a pedestrian is in the crosswalk.
- Remain stopped until the crosswalk is completely clear of both children and the crossing guard.
- Be mindful that crossing guards may need to re-enter the intersection to assist additional students before traffic resumes.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up Guidelines:

To maintain a safe and orderly environment during school drop-off and pick-up times, please follow these guidelines:

- Always pull up to the curb on the school side of the street for drop-off or pick-up.
- Never drop off or pick up passengers from the driver's side of the vehicle, as this creates an unnecessary hazard.
- Avoid double parking, as it blocks traffic and reduces visibility for other drivers and pedestrians.
- If curbside drop-off is not an option, park legally and walk your child across the street using a designated crosswalk or corner crossing.

By following these essential safety measures, we can work together to ensure that school zones remain safe and efficient for everyone.

What is the Junior Police Academy?

The Junior Police Academy is a fun and informative program geared toward seventh and eighth graders. The purpose of the program is to show students different aspects of law enforcement, as well as to meet some of our officers. The classes are often rotated and have included everything from defensive tactics, Passaic County Jail tours, K9 dogs, and the Passaic County bomb squad.

Who instructs the program?

The program is instructed solely by Hawthorne police officers.

Who can attend the Junior Police Academy?

The Junior Police Academy will only be accepting seventh and eighth grade students from Lincoln Middle School (LMS), Hawthorne Christian Academy, and St. Anthony's School. If you reside in Hawthorne but attend a school outside of town, you are also welcome to attend.

Where should I return the application?

You can return the application to the Hawthorne Police Department or the Boys and Girls Club of Hawthorne. You can also scan and email the application to Ptl. Zach Grochowski (6267@hawthornepdnj.org). Please make an *effort* to return it prior to the date listed on the application.

How long are the classes?

All evening LMS classes, the firearms safety demonstration, and SIDNE are 90 minutes long. Please be cognizant that we do not do the same courses every year.

Drop-off and pickup times:

The LMS drop-off and pickup are in the northeast playground, and the sign-in table is located in the lunchroom. All students must use the lunchroom door to enter. During pickup, parents are encouraged to park on the street. Students will be dismissed to the playground at 8:30 PM.

For SIDNE, the class will take place in the Kohler (150 Wagaraw Road) main parking lot at 9:00 AM. The entrance to the parking lot is on Wagaraw Road. Pickup is at 10:30 AM from the same parking lot.

For Firearms Safety, the Hawthorne Police Range is located behind the Wagaraw Baseball Fields and the Recycling Center. Follow the dirt road under the train trestle and make a right.

Can I pick my child up early?

We understand that family schedules are hectic. If you are planning on picking up your child early, please have your child advise one of the officers, or email Ptl. Zach Grochowski prior to the class.

What if my child cannot make it to the class?

Please email Ptl. Zach Grochowski of your child's absence. We encourage all students to attend a majority of the classes.

What if my child has a disability?

Please contact Ptl. Zach Grochowski, so that the program can be explained in depth. Our goal is to make sure all the students are safe and comfortable. The program is intended to mimic police training scenarios and often includes physical activity, loud noises, and other stimuli. Please be advised that although the program is conducted at LMS, there is no staffing from the Board of Education to assist with your child. A parent or designee of your choosing are welcome to attend with your child.

What should my child wear to class?

We strongly advise that your child wears athletic shoes, comfortable pants, or shorts, and their issued Junior Police Academy T-shirt.

Do students really get to shoot firearms at the range?

Yes! As police officers, we believe that it is important for everyone to know firearms safety. Our Range Master and firearms instructors will go over safety protocol and assist the students accordingly. If your child does not wish to shoot a firearm, please advise an instructor prior to the class or email Ptl. Zach Grochowski. We also have the option of using Simunition guns that shoot small paint pellets.

If your child has his/her own safety goggles, eye glasses, or ear protection, bring them to the range. otherwise, the officers will hand out ear protection to all students prior to the demonstration and eye protection prior to shooting.
