Dear Resident,

Today the Honorable Zoila S. Cassanova, Esq., Judge of the Surrogate Court, was at Borough Hall with her staff and 12 attorneys to assist residents in preparing free *Last Wills & Testaments* to qualified Passaic County residents. I want to thank her and Passaic County for making this possible. After many months of us working together, we were able to bring the program here for not only our residents, but residents throughout Passaic County. On May 3 the Passaic County Surrogate will host *Wills for Heroes* at the Passaic County Police Academy; please see the attached flyer for all the details.

This afternoon I was invited to a ribbon cutting ceremony at St. Joseph's Hospital, Wayne, for their Center for Wound Healing and Hyperbarics. If you have a wound that isn't healing properly, you may have what is referred to as a chronic or non-healing wound. Chronic wounds often arise from underlying medical issues like diabetes, poor circulation, pressure ulcers, or weakened immune systems, which disrupt the normal healing process. 



Advanced treatment options

Depending on the type of wound, the treatment plan may include:

- Infection control
- Restoration of blood flow
- Debridement (removal of dead tissue)
- Offloading

- Compression therapy
- Foot reconstruction
- Skin graft or flap



What is hyperbaric oxygen (HBO₂) therapy?

HBO₂ therapy is a medical treatment prescribed by a doctor to enhance the body's ability to heal.

During hyperbaric oxygen therapy, you breathe 100% pure oxygen while inside a pressurized chamber. The pressure inside this chamber is about two and a half times greater than the normal pressure in the atmosphere.

This high pressure environment allows your blood to carry more oxygen to all parts of your body to repair injured tissue. HBO₂ therapy also helps to fight certain infections, such as those that occur in the bone.

Many different conditions have been shown to benefit from HBO₂ therapy, especially chronic, non-healing wounds. HBO₂ therapy is often used in conjunction with other treatments.




